DIRECTOR

Dr. Jeanne Goffi-Fynn

Columbia professor, Dr. Jeanne Goffi-Fynn, is an active performer and teacher in New York City. Dr. Goffi-Fynn is the director of the Program in the Program of Music and Music Education at Teachers College, Columbia University, where she received her doctorate in Music and Music Education. Previously, she was on the faculty of New York University, the New School Actor's Studio M.F.A. Program, William Paterson University, and The American Musical and Dramatic Academy.



Dr. Goffi-Fynn has extensively worked in the area of Vocology, specifically in the area of retraining of singers. She completing an internship at the Grabscheid Voice Center, Mount Sinai Hospital in New York City with Dr. Linda Carroll, Ph.D. and Dr. Peak Woo, M.D. She has also trained at St. Luke's-Roosevelt Hospital with Dr. Anat Keidar, Ph.D. in the diagnosis and treatment of singing voice disorders. Dr. Goffi-Fynn credits the beginning of her teaching career to Dr. Barbara Doscher (author of The Functional Unity of the Singing Voice) with whom she studied voice and pedagogy in at the University of Colorado at Boulder.

As a Vocal Specialist, she has presented at numerous international and national conferences, including NATS (National Association of Teachers of Singing), The Voice Foundation, NYSTA (New York Singing Teachers Association), CMS (College Music Society), ACDA, NYSSMA and ISME (International Society for Music Education). She is currently a member of the American Academy of Teachers of Singing and serves as a participant at the National Opera Association's roundtables.

Jeanne is an active performer in the New York City area, singing in a variety of performance settings, often premiering newly commissioned works. Recent operatic roles include Marie in Daughter of the Regiment (updated version) with Opera Nova, Susanna (Le Nozze di Figaro) and Olympia (Les Contes d'Hoffmann). Concert and oratorio performances include The Cantata Singers (NYC), and Temple Emmanu-El (NYC) while performances in Europe include the Lugano Radio Orchestra (Switzerland) and the Romanian Radio Orchestra in a tour of Northern Italy. She has also studied and performed at the Zurich Opera Studio and with The American Institute of Musical Studies (A.I.M.S.) in Graz, Austria.

Chris Citera is an NYC-based actor, singer, and voice teacher currently serving as Head of Voice and Music for the BFA Theatre Arts program at Molloy University/CAP21, an Adjunct Instructor of Voice and Vocal Pedagogy at NYU Steinhardt, and an instructor in the music program at Teachers College, Columbia University. Previously, he taught in the musical theater programs at Pace University, the University of Texas at Arlington. Chris is also a core faculty member at BroadwayEvolved, an intensive training program founded by Betsy Wolfe.



Chris holds a Bachelor of Music in Voice and Acting from Ithaca College, **summa cum laude**, master's degrees (Ed.M, M.A) in Vocal Pedagogy and Music Education from Teachers College, Columbia University, and is currently pursuing his doctorate (Ed.DCT) there. His doctoral research critically examines patriarchal ideologies in voice pedagogy. Chris is recognized as a Vocologist by the Pan American Vocology Association (PAVA-RV) and holds a Distinguished Voice Professional Certificate from the New York Singing Teachers Association (NYSTA).

A lifelong learner and self-professed voice "nerd," Chris has been mentored and supervised extensively by singing voice specialist, Dr. Jeanne Goffi-Fynn.



As part of New York State's commitment to honor and celebrate the life and legacy of Dr Martin Luther King Jr., a team of documentary filmmakers is produced an hour-long film focusing on the civil rights icon's relentless pursuit of social, political, and economic equality for marginalized Americans.

Directed by Elan Bogarin and broadcast by PBS in January and February 2025, the project aims highlights individuals and organizations who are carrying on Dr King's work today in many ways, including through the arts.

The Singers' Workshops joined Columbia's Every Voice Choirs to perform "I Wish I Knew How It Would Feel to Be Free," included in the film.




CARNEGIE HALL



The Singers' Workshops joined <u>The Cecilia Chorus of New York</u> for a premiere performance of Adolphus Hailstork's "The World Called" at Carnegie Hall.

In the aftermath of the 2017 Charlottesville attack that claimed the life of Heather Heyer, Virginia-based composer Adolphus Hailstork quietly encoded her name into the chime motif of "The World Called," a setting of Rita Dove's "Testimonial." With Hailstork's blessing, this hidden tribute was now shared publicly for the first time in a concert dedicated to Heyer's memory.

The performance included a reading of "Testimonial" by Poet Laureate, Rita Dove and a moving speech Heather's mother, Susan Bro. See up warming up backstage at Carnegie Hall for the performance.




CONCERTS IN MOTION
